Oral Cancer

November is Oral Cancer Action Month. Oral cancer claims more lives than testicular and cervical cancer combined (*1).

Key Facts:

- Early diagnosis gives patients a 90% chance of survival.
 Delayed diagnosis means that survival rates are just 50%
- Mouth cancer rates have trebled in the last decade and is one of a few cancers that experts predict will continue to increase in the coming years

Risk Factors:

- The two leading factors in oral cancer are drinking too much alcohol and smoking, other risk factors include:
- Chewing tobacco
- Chewing Betel Nuts
- A poor diet
- Poor oral hygiene

Symptoms:

- Red or white patches in the mouth or throat
- A lump
- Persistent pain in mouth
- Pain or difficulty when swallowing
- Changes in your voice or speech problems
- Swollen lymph nodes (glands in your neck)
- Bleeding or numbness in the mouth
- A tooth or teeth that has become loose for no particular reason

Many of the symptoms listed above can be caused by less serious conditions, such as minor infections, but it is strongly recommended that you visit your dentist or GP if any of the above symptoms last more than three weeks. It is especially important to seek advice if you are a heavy drinker or smoker (*2). Regular check-ups are very important so that your dentist can check all areas of your mouth.

Teeth Whitening

Teeth whitening is an increasingly popular way of whitening your teeth without removing any of the tooth surface.

The process is simple, you will need to come into the practice to have some impressions taken of your teeth. The impressions will then be sent to a laboratory who will make your whitening trays. Once these have been made you will come back into the practice for a short visit and shown how to use the trays and whitening gels.

The whitening trays are usually worn with the gel every night for one to two weeks or until the desired whiteness achieved.

If, after a few years you would like to whiten your teeth again, there is no need to have the trays remade, all you need is the whitening gel.
